

# Safe Sanctuaries Policies

#### Remain above reproach:

- 1. Do not put yourself in a compromising situation with a student. Don't even put yourself in a situation where someone could doubt your intentions.
- 2. Don't be alone with a student. If you are sitting and "talking" with them, do it in plain sight of other folks. Hang out with three or more.
- 3. You are there simply to maintain order. So, bring in other folks if you need to. If discipline is a problem, consult the parents.
- 4. Do not use physical force with a student except when that student is in imminent danger of hurting themselves or somebody else.
- 5. Be mindful of conversations and topics that you have through email, phone, IM, text messages, and on social media. You are still the adult even away from the group.

### Risk Management:

- 1. Be smart. Use your common sense.
- 2. Set the standard in your dress and behavior.
- 3. Don't DARE or DOUBLE DARE.
- 4. Anticipate problems before they happen.
- 5. Recognize situations to avoid.

# Appropriate Touch:

- 1. Perfect the side hug. You can convey care and friendship and understanding with a high five or a pat on the back. Never give a full frontal hug.
- 2. Don't be the first to initiate a hug. Never be the last to let go.
- 3. If you sense that somebody doesn't want to be touched... DON'T.
- 4. Obviously, touch people in appropriate places. On the arm, elbow, shoulder, shake hands, high five.
- 5. Don't touch anybody for a prolonged period of time. There's no need to be piled on top of each other or sit in laps.

### Verbal:

- Sexual harassment includes "...the creation of an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working environment through verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature."
- 2. Jokes- keep them clean
- 3. Avoid language about parts of the body
- 4. Be careful in sharing personal information
- 5. Be respectful in commenting about another person

# Counseling:

- 1. If you are not a trained professional, know your limits.
- 2. If the topic of conversation turns to abuse, suicide, extreme eating disorders, cutting, etc...pass that conversation confidently onto someone who is qualified.
- 3. Let the person you're talking to know that if they tell you of a behavior that is dangerous to themselves or somebody else, you'll have to pass that on to the appropriate folks.

# Reporting:

- 1. Do not talk to the press or unauthorized people concerning a situation.
- 2. Report issues to the Senior Pastor.
